### ST VINCENT DEPAUL NEWS

The good news is that we were able to provide 132 families with food. 8 families came on Tuesday morning and 20 families came today. To put these numbers in perspective, we need only look at 2007. During May 2007 we served 63 families. We are now serving over twice as many families as last year at this time. Thank you for your on, going support. During restock weekend you provided twenty bags of food and household items.

We now have four volunteers to make a trip a month to the Freestore. The board of directors wants to have the pantry open Tuesday evening and Saturday morning. We have four volunteers for Tuesday evening and three for Saturday morning. If anyone is willing to volunteer once a week or once a month, please contact Kathy at 521-6206. We need at least five for each day we are open. Remember some people may help weekly and others may help only once a month.

The NCH Huntington Bank is having a food drive which will end June 8th. They are donating their collected items to the Alliance Food Pantry. We should pickup the food the week of June 9th.

The bad news is that we have provided 132 families with food. Our pantry shelves are depleted in several areas. The following items are in critical supply (our shelves are empty): pancake mix and syrup, spaghetti sauce. The following items also need replenishing: rice mix, noodle mix, fruit, canned meat such as ravioli, meatballs and spaghetti, shampoo, razors. Remember no donation is too great or too small. We are grateful for whatever donations you can provide.

### Dear Padre

#### *Which versions of the Bible are true?*

Dear Padre,

I have a question about contradictions in the Bible. There are two Creation stories and different accounts of how many animals Noah had on the ark. How do I know which versions are true?

*Biblically Confused,*

Dear Biblically Confused,

All of the versions are different ways of expressing the same teaching so, in a way, all are true. We Catholics are not fundamentalists. We do not read the Bible as if every word were true. We do not see it as a work of history, but of faith. We search for the theological meaning, for God's message, behind the words.

With respect to the different Creation stories, God is Creator. Whether that happened in an instant, in six days, or in millennia, the truth remains the same.

Another reason for different accounts of the same events is that some books weren't necessarily written by only one author. The Book of Isaiah, for example, was written by at least three different people, at three different times, and under three very different sets of circumstances.

Your questions touch on some complicated concepts that the Catholic Church has not always done a very faithful job of explaining. Interest in the Bible is growing among Catholics, and publishers like Liguori are producing Bible-study programs to meet those needs. I recommend you continue your personal study of God's sacred Scripture and, if possible, join a Catholic Bible-study group. And keep asking those questions.
